Mr. David Johnson called the meeting to order.

Mr. David Johnson called for a motion to approve the minutes of the February 20, 2024, meeting if no changes were needed. Mr. Daniel Jordan made the motion to accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Mickey Yates and passed with none opposed.

Ms. Tina Wells presented the Portal Highlights and Current Projects portion of the EOC reports:

- Tyler provided the Hudspeth Regional Center with a no-cost solution resulting in a \$15,000+ cost savings for the agency.
- Tyler recently met with the Mississippi Department of Mental Health to discuss a new template website for their Specialized Treatment Facility program.
- Tyler MS and the Mississippi State Personnel Board (MSPB) launched a redesigned website featuring enhanced accessibility for state agencies, streamlined job search for candidates and resulted in over \$15,000 in cost savings for MSPB.
- Tyler MS partnered with the Mississippi State Department of Health and the Mississippi ESF-8 Healthcare Coalition to launch a new website for the Healthcare Preparedness Program. The website provides access to vital resources and training opportunities for healthcare workers and provided a cost savings of more than \$10,000.
- Expanding Access to eCrash Reporting
  - Widely Utilized:
    - Adopted not only by the Department of Public Safety (DPS) but also by 67% of Mississippi counties, including the newly added Flora Police Department
  - o Citizen Convenience:
    - Enables quick and easy online purchase and download of crash reports of impact

#### o Results:

 Over 167,000 crash reports provided since 2019, generating \$2.5 million in online revenue for state and local government

  - Tyler presented a demonstration of the Human Resources Management platform, aiming to achieve MSDH's goal of transitioning to a paperless, automated personnel management system
- Benefits:
  - o Comprehensive suite of features including performance evaluations
  - o Employee portal for easy access to information
  - o Benefits enrollment for streamlined processes.

### Tyler MS and MBN Partner to Enhance Drug Disposal Processes

- Oversight:
  - The Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics (MBN) manages statewide reporting and disposal of illegal substances.
- · Collaboration:
  - The MBN and Tyler MS met to explore advanced solutions to enhance drug disposal processes.
- New Online System:
  - o Convenient access to disposal requirements for state agencies
  - Centralized platform for submitting information.
  - Administrative tools for efficient data collection and organization by MBN

#### **Advancing Digital Solutions for Mississippi Agencies**

- Enhancing Licensing Processes:
  - Tyler MS collaborated with the Mississippi Board of Examiners for Social Workers and Marriage and Family Therapists to improve student and reciprocity application procedures.
  - o Proposed platform aims to streamline application processes.
  - Benefits include an easy-to-use front-end application and real-time submission and payment management.

- Improving Public Boil Water Notice Handling:
  - Tyler MS engaged with the Mississippi State Department of Health to evaluate current procedures for managing public boil water notices in the Safe Drinking Water Program
  - New online service will automate intake and approval procedures, ensuring timely and accurate dissemination of information to residents.
